RASA MAURAGIS ARTISTS STATEMENT

Rasa's creative journey has had many twists and turns. She loves creating using the textile medium and stitch as well as playing with colour on cloth. Her recent journey along the ecoprinting path has opened up the world of monoprinting and mixed media. The work tends to fluctuate between pictorial, representational and abstract. The piece itself tends to dictate her approach and what she will use – commercial and/or naturally dyed or ecoprinted fabric, the techniques to be incorporated.

Two diverse approaches are incorporated in her work. An initial spontaneous approach is followed by a very structured plan to execute the idea/ideas that develop in its creation or vice versa – a structured plan but a serendipitous approach to its execution.

Travels in the Australian outback and the move to the Australian Snowy Mountains is providing a strong inspiration and focus for the direction of her current work. It focuses on her current environment by either using it as reference for the work or as the raw materials to create the work. She likes to use local foliage on silk, wool or paper. Printing with plant material provides her with a very earthy palette and provides for a very tactile and meditative working environment as she works with bark, leaves and flowers of plant snowy region. She loves the serendipity associated with using the same plant materials in different seasons and weather conditions.

Hand stitching, whilst it is very slow, provides a continuance of the contemplative and meditative creative environment and adds interesting textures to the work that does not occur when using machine stitching.
