# Calendar Celebrates 20th Anniversary

We are pleased to introduce the first calendar produced by The Old School House Arts Centre. The idea has been brewing for a few years, and, as 2008 marks the 20th Anniversary of the opening of the Art Centre, the time is now right. Although TOSH Coordinator, Corinne James, designed the finished product, many people were involved. The calendar has been created with the 2007 Grand Prix

d'Art Artists' outstanding paintings of picturesque locations in Qualicum Beach.

The 14<sup>th</sup> annual Grand Prix d'Art was held on July 28, 2007. Forty artists from Vancouver Island as well as the greater Vancouver area left their studios to convene in Qualicum Beach for a day of painting "en plein air". The Grand Prix d'Art is, indeed, a "race". Competing artists have to complete a work of art in the space of three hours. Each artist is assigned a zone in Qualicum Beach by lottery. The work has to represent or be inspired by some thing visible from the assigned location. The winners are

determined by a panel of three judges The 2007 Judges were Dan Gray (the 2006 Grand Prix d'Art winner) and artists John Barton and Sally Laidlaw.

Ivor Cohen took the photos of each painting so that they could be transferred to the calendar. Sandy Gray and Rusty Joerin submitted photos of the artists in action. All of these elements were put together to create a beautiful souvenir of Qualicum Beach and TOSH.

The calendar is available for a \$20.00 donation (\$1.00 for each year TOSH has been open) or 5 for \$85.00 so that you can send it to friends and family this holiday season.

The donations will support our ongoing programs, such as education, exhibitions and music, and enable us to continue our policy of extremely accessible pricing on all of our presentations.





# **Volunteer Voice by Arlene Angelo**

Whenever I am in my hometown of Saskatoon visiting Mom, I stop into the Mendel Art Gallery. This October I was fortunate enough to experience an installation by Graeme Patterson, a Sask. artist who, through sculpture, animation and video, has defined his hometown of Woodrow, Sask. His work held my attention for over an hour.

Another wing presented an early collection of illustrations by Ernie Lindner for a 1948 book. Mr. Lindner was my art teacher in high school. Every week I would cross the river from Nutana to Saskatoon Tech for two wonderful hours. Being from "the old school", Ernie would have us take pencil in hand and draw cubes, cones etc., and occasionally supervise a trip to an alley to draw garbage cans and such. He believed in the necessities

of drawing before applying paint. Lindner was also instrumental in the well-known Emma Lake sessions.

Ivor Cohen recently lent me two books by John Fowles. One was "Aristos", which contains several chapters on Fowles' definitions of art and the artist. He says an artist is someone who uses his abilities to create for three reasons:

- 1] to describe the outer world.
- 2] to express his/her feelings of that outer world.
- 3] to express his/her feelings about him/herself.

This third principal only came about in the last couple of centuries.
