EDWARD SNYDER is a well-known Saskatchewan wildlife wood sculpture/artist whose work is recognized among serious wildlife art collectors. An avid outdoorsman, this experience and field work has greatly influenced his art. Snyder's work is best known for its correctness of detail and originality. His work can be found in collections throughout North America.

PAT THOMPSON has spent 15 years working with and learning printmaking. She graduated from Michigan State University in 1970, with a major in sculpture and painting. Adding to her printmaking skills have been classes in etching and lithography at Victoria College of Art and Emily Carr College of Art & Design. She feels that art and image making is a way of bridging to spiritual reality from the material world; it is at the limits of perception and imagination: Pat is a resident studio artist in The Old School House, maintaining her printmaking shop in a ground floor estudio.

WILLIAM TOWNSEND is one of British Columbia's better known artists. His works sell across Canada and also hang in private collections in Germany, Japan, Australia, Egypt and the U.S. Working mainly in oil, watercolour and silkscreen prints, he has garnered many major corporate commissions. His work focuses on the Rocky Mountains and West Coast scenes. Now a resident of Nanoose Bay, Townsend's former homes include Australia.

JOSE TRINIDAD was born in the Phillipines where he obtained a degree in Fine Arts at the University of the Phillipines. In 1968 he emigrated to Canada via San Franciso and travelled throughout the West Coast. His artwork blends oriental influence with vivid colour and impressionism. He has not only made a name for himself in Canada and North America, but is also acclaimed in Europe. One can easily detect that he is also inspired by children, capturing their emotions and humour. His works are hung in private and corporate collections throughout the world.

KRISTEEN VERGE was born in Montreal in 1950. She lived in Quebec City for twenty years where she graduated from Laval University in Graphical Art with a major in Illustration. With her husband Roland Marion she has maintained a pottery stuio for 12 years, participating in major craft shows in Quebec, Montral and Toronto during that time. Kristeen also paints on fabric which she enjoys very much. Her painting is fresh, whimsical and often quite humourous. She loves the idea of people wearing art work. Both Roland and Kristeen are delighted to be resident artists

ROBERT WALKER is inspired by the lighthouses of the West Coast. He has painted 17 of 32 lighthouses off the coast of Vancouver Island. Walker's works are bold and confident, and his enthusiasm for his subject makes his canvases vibrant with energy. Strongly influenced by Emily Carr, the Group of Seven and E.J. Hughes, Walker blends blues and greens into swirling seas that surround the tall, slender lighthouses.





Success under sunny skies was the order of the day at the Second Annual Art Auction and Garden Party at the Milner estate May 21.

Through community donations and auctioned artworks more than \$30,000 was raised for the Old School House Gallery and Art Centre.

Maynard's auctioneer Brad Scott swiftly and expertly sold more than 50 pieces of work in a little over two hours. Surrounded by the beauty of the Milner estate, people had a chance to both purchase art and meet the artists.

QUALICUM BEACH - Sixteen artists have responded to an invitation issued by The Old School House Gallery and Art Centre to participate in an exhibition, "A tribute to the Brant Habitat."

The exhibition will open with the Brant Festival, April 1 and will continue in the Mini-

Gallery until April 10.

The pieces submitted are in a variety of mediums including watercolor, oils, acrylics pastels and hand-pulled etchings. Artists residing in the district include Wanda Ashmore, Peggy Burkosky, Sid and Jessi Barron, Dan Gray, Bill Helin, Browni Joerin, Pauline Pike, Marguerite Stevens and Bill Townsend.

All of the participating artists have received a variety of special awards.





Works of art by local artists Dorothy Francis and William Townsend will hit the auction block this Sunday, beside works by Toni Onley and Robert Bateman, in the fifth annual Old School House Gallery, Art Auction and Garden Party.

In past years the auction has raised between \$30.\$35,000 for the gallery and art centre. Manager Marlys Diamond said the money raised goes toward operating expenses. The gallery does not receive government funding.

Auction previews Friday Eighty original works, valued at about \$50,000, have been donated for auction. At last count, 43 local artists have donated works.

They can be previewed at the Old School House until August 9.

The auction and garden party will be at the estate of Genevieve Brown in Qualicum Beach. A bus service will shuttle ticket holders between the Old School House and the auction site, starting at 12:30 p.m., Sunday, Aug 11.

Art auction ticket sales on target for art lovers

Ticket sales are brisk, as knowledgeable art lovers and art buyers make plans to attend The Old School House's Fifth Annual Art Auction, to be held on Sunday, August 11 in Qualicum Beach.

Eight works of art will be put on the auction block at this year's gala event. Almost all are originals, donated by supportive B.C. artists, to assist with fundraising for The Old School House Gallery and Art Centre. Proceeds from the sale of tickets and artworks permit the continuation of the varied cultural programs at the Art Centre.


A preview of all the auction pieces will be on display at The Old School House, 122 Fern Road West, Qualicum Beach, from August 3 to 9. A special evening opening is scheduled for Thursday, August 8, from 7 to 9 p.m. Donating artist Neil Howell will officially open the Art Auction Preview on Saturday, August 3, at 11:00 a.m.

Howell, a resident of Comox, B.C., is a painter whose work in oils is in high demand. He has developed a unique approach combining abstraction and realism in his painting of primarily ethnic subjects, especially Plains and West Coast Native people. After retirement from the oil industry in Calgary, he moved to Comox to take up sport salmon fishing and painting. He has studied with John Millhill, Stafford Plant,

Bill Townsend, and other F.C.A. artists. Howell's work enjoyed immediate success, and he was recently invited to participate in the 1991 Calgary Exhibition Stampede Western Art Show.

Howell will be giving an instructive workshop on portraits at The Old School House Gallery and Art Centre in October. In the summer of 1992, he will be exhibiting his work in TOSH's Brown Gallery, in a show featuring his paintings of the R.C.M.P. Musical Ride. The piece he has donated for this year's Art Auction is the first in the series, entitled "For the Want of a Nail". Howell has supported the objectives of The Old School House since his contribution to the first TOSH Art Auction in 1987.

All proceeds from the popular auction will go to the recently-opened Old School House Gallery and Art Centre in Qualicum Beach.


Auction organizer Larry Jacobson says artists who donated work last year were invited to donate again this year, but "over 70 per cent of work donated this year is from new artists."


