


## The Old School House Firts Centre

The Old School House Art Centre (TOSH) in Qualicum Beach, B.C. was established for the purpose of attracting community members as well as tourists to participate in cultural activities. It has been accomplishing this purpose for over 22 years. TOSH is open year round and has diverse programming (education, exhibitions and music).

The Exhibition Program is designed to provide a forum for local residents and visitors to learn, appreciate and purchase original works of art. It is a venue for highlighting West Coast culture and promoting the value of art to individuals of all ages. It also provides amateur and professional artists and craftspeople the opportunity to promote awareness and revenue from their respective arts, crafts and guilds. TOSH offers monthly and/or bi-monthly exhibitions in three galleries for a total of 36 exhibitions annually.



Last February we extended a national call for entry for a winter juried exhibition coinciding with the Olympic Games in Whistler/Vancouver. Approximately 60 paintings were to be juried into the exhibition by Judges Don Farrell, Merv Brandel and Gerda Hofman, three local, internationally respected artists. In order to give artists of all skill levels a chance to be exhibited, 10 additional paintings were to

be drawn from a lottery of the remaining entries.

The deadline for entries was October 10, 2009. Participating artists were asked to send JPEG photo files. The judges selected the paintings that will be hung in the gallery on February 1, 2010 along with the 10 paintings brought in by lottery, and the winners were chosen from all of these paintings.

The first prize is \$2010.00, second prize is \$1000.00 and third prize is \$500.00. Each winner also receives a commemorative vase created by First Nations artist Terry Jackson

The Opening Reception is on February 10, and the show will hang until March 28, 2010. The three winning paintings are featured in an ad in the 2010 Winter edition of *Galleries West* art magazine.

When jurying, my considerations for the most part focus on how well the paintings have been assessed compositionally. How well have they been orchestrated with shapes, values and, of course, colour? In representational painting, evaluating drawing skill is an important consideration as well, keeping in mind the intent and style of the work. In other words not showing an over-reliance on photographs which impedes compositional considerations. When artists submit more than one painting, consistency is also assessed, as this is important for an exhibition.

I felt that there was a lot of good work submitted for the competition. It was difficult to pick only 60 paintings because there were so many others I wanted to include in the show. Space was limited. For me the most important element in a good painting is the composition. Second is how well the artist uses the materials to develop the painting. Color is the next factor. Did the colours work with each other and did they make the eye move around the painting? I was looking for colour contrasts and a good use of grays to pull the eye to the focal point. All these elements have to be correct in order to develop a good painting.




