We are carrying on what has become an annual summer tradition by exhibiting some of the finest artists working on Vancouver Island. On the upper level of TOSH we will celebrate the west coast art scene with varied mediums and home-grown talent. This summer, works from Victoria painter Brian Simons and pieces by local potter Alison Tang will be shown with works by popular Vancouver Island artist, Brian Scott in an exhibition running from June 25 to July 22. The next exhibition (July 23 to August 19) will include paintings and sculpture by Mike Keller of Qualicum Bay, local painter Devon Featherstone and local wood turner Doug Fisher. Rounding out the summer series of exhibitions (August 20 through September 15) will be the works of top artists from the Arrowsmith Chapter of the Federation of Canadian Artists along with sculpture by Fernade Draper.

Grand Prix d'Art 2007

This year's "race" will take place on Saturday, July 28, 2007 from 11 am to 2 pm This event has become a major attraction for merchants, artists, and visitors.

TOSH is preparing for the 13th annual Grand Prix d'Art artist race. Grand Prix d'Art is a "painting race"; competing artists must complete a work of art "en plein air" in the space of three hours. Each artist is assigned a location in Qualicum Beach by lottery. The work must represent or be inspired by some thing or person that is visible from the assigned location.

Last year the **Grand Prix d'Art** attracted over forty artists and countless visitors. This year's **Grand Prix d'Art** falls on the same day as the St. Mark's Fair, and we encourage visitors to browse through town with the help of a map showing artists' locations. In 2003, Fern decided to pursue her clay sculpting and realized she was able to transform the clay into a flowing, moving energy. This allowed her to express her feelings in an unlimited way. Fern then decided to sculpt full time. "I place the clay on a turntable and rotate it till a form or a feeling comes through and the sculpture starts to take shape I must totally get into the feeling and emotions of the movement...to feel it...to sense it...make it come alive in the movement and flow. While sculpting I find my inner peace...my meditation. It is important to me that the viewers of my sculptures can sense what I am feeling.
