## APOD GRANT

The Old School House has received a from grant Arts Partners Organizational Development (APOD). This "threshold" grant will pay for an expert Needs Assessment which will probably be carried out in February. We would then be eligible to apply for a second grant for expert assistance in Plan Development. These grants are intended to provide short term assistance to strengthen professional arts and cultural organizations in BC, thereby contributing to their long term sustainability.

APOD is a funding body sponsored by the City of Vancouver, the BC Arts Council, the Department of Canadian Heritage, and the Vancouver Foundation - all people we would like to get to know better. The grant is strategically important as a credible way of introducing The Old School House to the community of arts-funding agencies and foundations and could lead to additional funding in the future.
