

Sunday Painters' Exhibition

The Old School House is pleased to host our fourth annual Sunday Painters' Exhibition in the tradition and spirit of the popular show of the same name held annually at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts during the 40's, 50's and 60's. If you are a recreational artist or art student

we invite you to submit your best paintings or drawings (no more than a total of three) for inclusion in this JURIED exhibition. A panel of three qualified jurors will view all of the work submitted and will select, on the basis of artistic merit, prizes in each medium: oil/acrylic, pastel and watercolour.

No professional artist or craftsperson of any kind is eligible.

The exhibition is restricted to two-dimensional paintings, drawings, and prints other than photographic prints.

TOSH February 10

A call for entry will be extended across Canada to be included in the juried exhibition coinciding with the Olympic Games in Whistler/Vancouver. Approximately 60 paintings will be juried in the exhibition by Judges Don Farrell, Merv Brandel and a third judge to be determined. 10 paintings will also be hung by lottery winning from the entries to give artists of all skill levels a chance to participate. The first prize will be \$2010.00. Other prizes will be determined, and we will also try to give the artists recognition with a photo spread in national publications. The deadline for entries will be October 10, 2009. The entry fee is \$20.00 for the first painting and \$10.00 for the second painting. The artists will be asked to send jpegs, which will then be transferred to a CD from which the judges will work. The judges will shortlist 50 paintings to be hung in the gallery on February 8, and the winners will be chosen from the paintings hanging in the gallery. There will be an Opening Reception on February 10, and the show will hang until March 21. Volunteers to help with this unprecedented national event at The Old School House Arts Centre would be welcome and may apply to Corinne James. More information will appear on our website as the plans develop.



Digital Image Submission Procedure:

Save image in JPEG (.jpg) file format only. Size of image: at least 1200 pixels x 1500 pixels at 300 ppi (pixels per inch) with a maximum size of 2000 pixels on the largest dimension (either height or width)

Name the file as follows: last name, first name or initial, title of work, size and medium.

Example: Smith, R, Fresh Flowers, 16x20, Acrylic.jpg

visible.

The baby grand piano donated by Ulrike Stadler.

The year started off on a high note with the donation of a baby grand piano. Ulrike Stadler sold her house and returned to Germany but could not take her piano with her. She asked a friend, Linda Lambert, to contact TOSH in December to say that she had enjoyed many concerts at Music On Sunday and wished to donate her piano for the enjoyment of the community. The snow prevented delivery of the piano until January, and then, thanks to a donation by Vivien Sears, it was professionally moved to its temporary location in the Dorothy Francis Gallery. (It is a good thing we enlarged the gallery three years ago.) The piano is made by Young Chang, a Korean company. It will not take the place of our beautiful Seiler salon grand donated for concerts by Leah and Howie Meeker six years ago. TOSH will make the Young Chang piano available for rent by music teachers in the area for student recitals. The plan is to remove the counter in the Volunteer Gallery and place the piano in that larger space. The proceeds from the *April in Paris* live music evening (April 18)will help to fund the project. Also, If any advanced pianists wish to rent the Young Chang piano for practice during the day, the fees would also help with the cost of the renovation.

TOSH wishes to thank Mrs. Stadler for her generous donation.

The Art from the Attic Sale

This year the Art from the Attic Sale had a new twist. TOSH invited well-known local and not-so-local artists to submit a painting at a greatly reduced price to encourage our members to collect something that matters...artwork. The artists delivered outstanding pieces.

138 incredible paintings were hung, and 29 were sold in six days with 75% of the sale price going to the artists.

The Art from the Attic Sale followed with 276 paintings brought in by the community, and 106 paintings were sold

at prices from \$5.00 and up. Thank you to the artists and the community for their support in these two events. A special thanks to the Hanging Committee for putting up all those paintings in two weeks and to Mike Green for filling all the nail holes afterwards!

Marney-Rose Edge is from the Lower Mainland and will be exhibiting in the Volunteer Gallery. "My inspiration for Garden Daze comes from being an avid gardener. I'm passionate about florals and get so excited watching the beauty that bursts into bloom. Another inspiration is the life that occupies the garden and seeing the two connect drives me to the palette. I strive to capture and share the emotion of the light and life of the garden".

Dave Davies will be the Dorothy Francis Gallery. He is a TOSH Resident Artist. "Prior to retirement I enrolled in an introductory watercolour class, took advantage of workshops, and was fortunate to have the opportunity to paint with some inspiring people in the Kootenays. Retirement in 2004 brought us to Oceanside and afforded the luxury of time to indulge my passion. Our recent travels have provided numerous visual memories, some of which are represented in this show. I look forward to putting more on them on paper in the coming years." Dave has entitled his show Destination Tibet.

Our Annual Photography Exhibition will follow on April 13 to May 3. The Reception is on April 15. This year we are featuring a group of local photog-"Oceanside raphers. Photographers was formed to give photographers from the region a forum in which to learn about photography and to share knowledge with others in a casual and convivial atmosphere. Experience within the group ranges from novice to professional, and we do our best to keep everyone challenged and engaged, regardless of their level of expertise. Beyond our monthly meetings, it's important that we use our images to the benefit of the community; whether simply as artful entertainment, or to bring attention to broader issues. Our past and future projects include such topics as wildlife habitat, literacy, and local attractions. Photography can play a powerful role in addressing areas of concern in our society and our environment." Oceanside Photographers meets at 7pm on the 1st Wednesday of the month at the Qualicum Beach Civic Centre.

Luke Downs is exhibiting in the Volunteer Gallery. "When I look around me, things and scenes I see stand out from their surroundings in a very

particular way. As I stand and look at it, the world resolves into shapes and forms, and I like to transmit this....... to show them, to reveal them. It doesn't really matter what they are or represent. It's bringing them out that's important. In fact, I've found that they represent different things to different people and I enjoy that."

Brad Grigor exhibit his digital art in the Dorothy Francis Gallery. " Digital painting is a type of digital art but it is not 'computergenerated' art in that it does not involve the computer's automatic rendering from mathematical models created by the artist. In digital painting, the artist uses painting techniques to create the image directly on the computer. Digital painting is also distinct from digital manipulation of photographs in that it is an original construction 'from scratch'. While photographic elements may be incorporated into digital paintings, they are not the primary basis or source for them. I also believe that art must reflect the imagination of the artist, otherwise how are we to distinguish art from documentation or technique? If I have succeeded, when you look at my work, hopefully you will wonder what I was imagining when I created the image and not how I created it".

fitted with hanging wire and ready for exhibition, except that high school students need not frame their work provided it is ready to hang.

The length plus width (outside dimensions) of the work including picture frame shall not exceed 36 inches by 36 inches.

A non-refundable entry fee of \$5 will be charged for each piece submitted, except that the fee for high school students will be waived.

Artwork must be delivered to TOSH between 10:00 am and 12:00 noon on Monday, March 30, 2009 and must be picked up on Saturday, April 11, 2009 after noon.

The Jury will award ribbon prizes for each medium and for high school students.

If you choose to offer your work for sale, your price will be understood to include the frame. All sales are subject to a 30% selling commission to TOSH.

Ivor Cohen (artist and judge) will once again offer a Critique for artists who choose to attend on Thursday, April 2nd.

The students will supply their own digital cameras for photographing the model and paint supplies and easels for painting. For added value, each student will receive a CD of the best photos. Photography with Roger Moore: "Beauty From the Beast - How to make beautiful photos from that silly little digital camera" Who should come? -This course is designed for beginners wanting to learn how to use their digital cameras. No photographic experience necessary, just own a digital camera and have the desire to learn how to use it to make the best photos of your life. Great photos are made between your ears and in your heart; the camera only records them. Course Description - Almost everyone now has a digital camera, and many who own them are still perplexed about how to use them. This course is designed to not only help you learn how to use your camera but also how to make beautiful photos with them, and, more importantly, how to have FUN, FUN, FUN with your little camera. Each session will be "hands-on" with plenty of personal attention and assistance. The student will learn the theory behind how the darnned thing works. What are all these buttons, dials, and knobs?

For More Serious photographers: Making Panoramic Images from a Standard Digital Camera. These people must know how to use their equipment and must know how to use Adobe CS3 or CS4, and must bring a laptop computer to use in class. Session 1: I will discuss and demonstrate how to make panoramic images with a standard digital camera and make assignment to create images to bring to next class. Session 2: We will work on the laptops to stitch the images, review and select the ones for the show. Assignment is to get them printed. Session 3: Receive the prints for the show and to review and discuss problems and opportunities in panoramics. The course shall be taught in three sessions on Saturday afternoons: July 4, 11th, and 18th). Each session will run from 1:00 to 3:00 Cost: \$100.00 for members \$110.00 for nonmembers. The workshops will end with a slide show of the students' best shots running continuously in the lobby of TOSH for one week.






