On the first day of February we will finally hang The National Juried Art Show. We have been working on this exhibition for over one year. This is the largest exhibition project that TOSH has conducted to date. Last spring a committee began e-mailing every possible art group, gallery, and individual artist in Canada inviting artists to participate in this national painting contest that will coincide with the Olympic Games in Whistler/Vancouver from February 10 to March 28.

The response was slow at first, and the committee was concerned that the event might not get off the ground. We had applied for funding to offset the expenses, but the targeted grants did not come in, and, in fact, this year TOSH did not receive the Gaming Funds that we have enjoyed for the past few years. We were concerned that if we did not have sufficient entries we could not afford the fabulous prizes.

Suddenly, three weeks before the deadline in mid-October,

entries began to arrive. The most distant province to send entries was Quebec, and the province that sent the most entries was British Columbia. The artists were required to send their paintings to TOSH via e-mail, and those images were collected on "flash drives" to be delivered to the judges. In the end, there was an overwhelming response to the event, and our judges, Merv Brandel. Don Farrell and Gerda Hofman had hundreds of images to choose from. The judges juried 60 paintings into the exhibition, and ten more paintings were added by lottery. (It was felt that since TOSH is a learning facility we must ensure that artists of all levels could have a chance to participate in the event.) The Judges awarded the First Prize (\$2010.00) to

Royden Josephson for his acrylic triptych called *Olympic Suite*. Second Prize (\$1000.00) is awarded to Joan Skeet for her mixed media painting, *Scratch*, and Arlene Nesbitt receives Third Prize (\$500.00) for her photomontage *Midway to the End*. In addition, the Town Council of Qualicum Beach will award the three winners commemorative

vases created by first nations artist Terry Jackson. Six paintings have received Honourable Mention. These artists are: Megan Arundel,Dene Croft, Dorothe Einsenhardt, Colin Spencer, Fay St. Marie, Cecile Vanwoensel and Steve Wilson

A catalogue of the paintings will be printed and available for purchase to help with the expenses of the event. The Opening Reception will be on Wednesday, February 10 at 7pm, and many artists will attend. All members are invited.





Journey Toward Personal Artistic Style With Nicholas Pearce

The way we paint comes from the way we see and think. This three-day workshop will explore how our ideas and preferences shape our art and help us to identify our own personal artistic style.

This workshop provides a guided tour of our individual artistic engines and allows us to use this self-knowledge to take the next step in our creative development. Friday: We will look at the nature of style, challenging our preconceived notions and opening ourselves up to create room for growth. We will form small groups to view paintings that illustrate different styles throughout art history. You will list the elements - including subject matter - that you are drawn to in the paintings. With this list, you will go home to choose an image to paint. Saturday: Return to class with your list and the image you've chosen. For the rest of the weekend, we paint our chosen subjects, using the elements we have identified as important in our art. Where available, I will print a copy of a painting from history to use as a reference that best illustrates those elements. Then the class will paint. Sunday: Paint... We will all use acrylic for simplicity, but you will choose your canvas, brush size and colour palette.
