

"Time and Place"

This is a showing of photography by Denman Island artist, **Paul Bailey**. The boldly colourful images reveal, through Mr. Bailey's use of close-up techniques and incamera manipulation, the abstract qualities of the ordinary world that surrounds us. Mr. Bailey is the creator and teacher of a Professional Photography Certificate Program at North Island College in Courtenay. Over the course of the last two decades he has presented numerous shows in various West Coast galleries.





### "Faeries and Mermaids"





Grant Leier: "Happy Times"

Ray Bradbury: "Land Forms"


