In 1984 Farrell was awarded the "Royal Institute Medal" in The Water Colours annual exhibition in London, England and shortly thereafter he was made a full member of the Institute. In 1985 he was elected as a member of the Royal Society of British Artists. His work was selected for the Royal Academy of Art Summer Exhibitions in 2004 and 2005. In recent years there has been a marked change in Farrell's work - from essentially figurative imagery towards the abstract. The works contain recurring motifs of tiny unidentified objects and often, etched into the background, are characters or patterns or even a hint of narrative. These are the qualities that make Farrell's paintings rewarding when inspected more closely.



While studying drawing and painting at N.Y. University with Philip Guston and then at the Art Student's League with Arnold Blanche, Riopel experimented with all manner of making art but worked mostly in an impressionist, painterly style. After moving to Qualicum Beach in 2000, Riopel took a pastel course and was struck by the immediacy, the physicality and directness of application of that medium. Painting with sticks of pure pigment set loose an explosion of energy that moved her ever closer to the abstract. She frequently works in series and her current work parallels still life and landscape - both created in her own reality. "I don't know where the ideas come from so I just get out of the way and let it flow."
